- Cultural Immersion – The Bunya Mountains Indigenous Experience offers a deep dive into the traditions, stories, and customs of the local Aboriginal people, particularly the Wakka Wakka, Jarowair, and Barrungam groups.
- Ancient Bunya Gatherings – Historically, the Bunya Mountains were a significant meeting place where Indigenous groups from across Queensland gathered for ceremonial feasts, storytelling, and cultural exchanges centered around the bunya nut harvest.
- Guided Bushwalks & Dreaming Stories – Visitors can join Indigenous guides on bushwalks to learn about native plants, bush tucker, traditional healing practices, and Dreamtime stories connected to the land.
- Traditional Arts & Crafts – Experience hands-on workshops featuring traditional weaving, painting, and cultural crafts, showcasing the rich artistic heritage of the region's Indigenous peoples.
- Connection to Country – The experience fosters a deep respect for Indigenous land stewardship, teaching visitors about sustainable practices, sacred sites, and the spiritual significance of the Bunya Mountains.



TOUR DETAILS

Smoking Ceremony & Bush Uni Walk

You will be welcomed to the Bunya Mountains with a traditional smoking ceremony and an introduction to the Bunya's significance by a Tribal Custodian. On a guided interpretation walk to the Bush Uni, your guide will share stories on traditional land management practices, the concept behind the creation of the Bush Uni and importance of Connection to Country. The Bush Uni features a collection of installations depicting important timelines, cultural stories and ceremonial practices. The walk to the Bush Uni is 1km return along a designated formed earthen track.

- Departure Time: As agreed with host
 - Days of Operation: By appointment
 - Duration: 1.5 - 2 hours
 - Min/Max Numbers: Minimum 15 – Maximum 40
 - Inclusions: Smoking ceremony, Guided site tour with Tribal Custodian; insightful commentary about the site and Aboriginal culture.
- (NOTE: Medium level mobility required as site includes walking distances of up to 1km – moderate slope descending and ascending.)

Ranger Guided Rainforest Walk

Join a Tribal Custodian ranger on a guided Rainforest Walk in the Bunya Mountains. Discover how this Rainforest was a source of life for Aboriginal People. Specifically, how native Australian plants were used for food, shelter, medicine, clothing, utensils, tools and weapons. Your ranger will share stories of traditional plant use and how Aboriginal people learned to detoxify toxic plants to a level of safety.

- Days of Operation: By appointment
 - Duration: 45 mins – 1 hour
- Min/Max Numbers: Minimum 10 – maximum 20
- Inclusions: Guided interpretive walk of an established Rainforest track with Tribal Custodian; bush tucker & traditional land management commentary
